












Message from the Chairman Emeritus

Message from the Chairperson

Message from the President

LOOKING BACK INTO THE YEAR JUST PASSED, WHAT DOMINATED THE SCENE WAS THE IMPACT OF THE GLOBAL FINANCIAL CRISIS ON THE WORLD ECONOMY. BDO WAS NOT SPARED AS THE BANK REGISTERED MIXED RESULTS IN ITS OPERATING PERFORMANCE FOR 2008.

We experienced substantially lower trading income due to mark-to-market revaluations and we also increased provisions to cover for potential losses from our exposure in the US financial sector. Mark-to-market revaluations alone reduced the Bank's net income by P2.9 billion and net asset value by P6.1 billion. Even with what may be considered one-off charges from a difficult economic environment, the Bank still registered a respectable net income of P2.2 billion for the year. Despite these developments, the Bank's balance sheet remains strong and among the best capitalized in its peer group, a testament to its ability to withstand great shocks in the market.

We should not, however, let the crisis overshadow the strategic progress we have made on our Bank. We completed operational integration of the BDO-EPCI merger in May 2008, less than a year from legal merger. The Bank is now operating as one entity with one face to the public and one set of services across the whole network. The consolidation created market-leading positions in most of the Bank's core business lines, including one of the largest branch networks in the country. The top line benefits of the merger were already apparent from the strong performance of the Bank's underlying lending, funding and service businesses. Despite the growth, asset quality improved as the Non-Performing Loan Ratio declined to 4% from 5.2% in 2007. On a net basis, BDO has now the lowest delinquency among its peer group.

We also concluded the year with our Bank being ranked first in resources, trust assets, loans and deposits. While size was never the overriding objective for us, it gives market validation that we are on the right track in meeting the needs of our customers. We believe that size is just a by-product of doing what we do, relatively well.

Notwithstanding the mixed results of 2008, the foundations are now firmly in place to allow us to maximize the synergy brought about by our merger and our new place in the industry's competitive landscape. We still have a lot of work ahead of us, not the least of which is to realize fully the cost efficiencies of our expanded scale. We remain focused on keeping our clients and customers at the center of everything we do as we believe that will continue to be the driver of our future growth.

Our collective efforts have enabled us to ride through the 2008 financial storm and we thank you for continued support, trust and confidence during these difficult times. While 2009 may not present a substantially better economic climate, BDO is definitely in a much better shape to move forward during these uncertain times.

Review of 2008 Operations Economic Environment & 2009 Outlook

THE PHILIPPINE ECONOMY REMAINED RESILIENT

IN 2008. STRONG FUNDAMENTALS ENABLED IT TO WITHSTAND GLOBAL MACROECONOMIC HEADWINDS ARISING FROM RECORD OIL AND RICE PRICES THAT LED TO SPIKES IN INFLATION, AND A LIQUIDITY CRISIS THAT PUMMELED FINANCIAL MARKETS WORLDWIDE.

A record performance in 2007 gave the country its position of strength going into 2008. Foreign exchange reserves had been built up to record highs, providing a buffer against severe market volatility. The consumption-driven nature of the economy and the sustained growth in Overseas Filipino Worker (OFW) remittances shielded the country from a floundering external demand. The government actively pursued pump-priming activities to mitigate the impact of the global crisis, even as it kept its budget deficit below target. Moreover, the country's banking system remained in good shape, as evidenced by the banks' strong capital positions, declining non-performing loans, minimal exposure to toxic financial instruments, and the availability of domestic liquidity sources.

These positive factors cushioned the Philippines from the full adverse impact of the global challenges last year. The country managed a 4.6% rise in GDP, albeit slower than the record 7.2% expansion in 2007. Domestic demand, led by private consumption spending (+4.5%) and government expenditures (+4.3%), compensated for the negative export performance. On the production side, services remained the key driver with a 4.9% increase, contributing 2.4 percentage points to GDP growth.

Meanwhile, net factor income from abroad, lifted by robust migrant dollar incomes, propelled GNP growth to 6.1% in 2008, from 8.0% in 2007.

INFLATION

Global commodity price surges sent the country's headline inflation rate accelerating to double-digits in

early 2008, before slowing down toward the end of the year. From 4.9% in January, the inflation rate rose to 8.3% YoY in April, as the rice shortage intensified amid accelerating global oil prices (the latter hit a record high \$147/barrel in July). By August, inflation peaked at 12.4% as it reflected the effects of wage and transport fare adjustments. Inflation decelerated toward the end of the year as global commodity prices fell on slowing demand, with the December headline rate moderating to 8%. The average inflation rate ended at 9.3% in 2008, a level managed in the context of a tumultuous year but far from the 2.8% recorded in 2007.

INTEREST RATES

Interest rates mirrored the movements in inflation. From a 3.7% average in January, the benchmark 91-day Treasury Bill jumped to 5.7% in July amid BSP policy rate hikes to manage inflation pressures; meanwhile, rates in the secondary market hit above 7% as inflation peaked. The BSP had raised its policy rates by a total of 100 bps from June to August 2008, bringing the overnight borrowing rate to 6% and the overnight lending rate to 8%.

However, subsiding inflation pressures during the latter part of the year prompted the BSP to revert to a more accommodative monetary policy, reducing banks' reserve requirements by 200 bps to 19% and cutting its key rates by 50 bps in December. By year-end, the benchmark rate had settled to 6.1%, resulting in an average 91-day T-Bill rate of 5.4% in 2008 or 200 bps higher than 3.4% in 2007.



FOREIGN EXCHANGE

Erratic movement and intermittent volatility characterized the currency markets in 2008, resulting in the peso's weaker performance vis-àvis its record appreciation in 2007. The peso started the year strongly, breaching the P40 level in February. However, the appreciation was not sustained due to large capital outflows on heightened investor risk aversion to emerging markets. The peso ended the year at P47.48 from the end-2007 level of P41.40, representing a depreciation of 14.7%. The average stood at P44.47 in 2008 from P46.15 in 2007.

FISCAL PERFORMANCE

The government again stayed within its programmed deficit ceiling in 2008, as the actual deficit of P68.1 billion (-1% of GDP) was below the P75 billion target. The government's consistent performance was largely credited to one-off gains (e.g., privatization proceeds) that lifted total revenues, compensating for the lower tax collections due to the economic slowdown and tax relief granted to workers. Although much

higher than the P12.4 billion deficit in 2007, the budget gap in 2008 reflected the government's increased fiscal spending designed to mitigate the impact of the global crisis.

Outlook for 2009

The outlook for 2009 remains challenging as the Philippine economy feels the full brunt of the global slowdown. Weak consumption and employment trends are aggravated by slower external demand, dampening prospects for the country's export sector. Meanwhile, continuing market uncertainty and cautious investor sentiment stifle the inflow of both direct and portfolio foreign capital, adding pressure on the Peso. A deeper and longer global recession presents further risks to the country's growth prospects.

While these challenges serve to temper the outlook this year, the Philippine economy is forecast to weather the storm as it continues to draw on its key strengths. Domestic demand is expected to drive much of economic growth this year on the back of a stable consumer sector. Consumption spending should get a lift from an enhanced purchasing power on higher tax exemptions, decelerating inflation (seen lower on base effects and falling global commodity prices) and easing interest rates. A weaker Peso (translating to higher peso equivalent to a U.S. dollar) should compensate for the slower growth in OFW remittances in 2009. Meanwhile, the added stimulus from the government's expansionary budget and vital contribution from the country's active informal sector should stimulate economic activity and enable a respectable growth this year.

By drawing on its resilience and managing to attain growth amid the difficulties, the country should be able to look ahead and stand well-positioned for the expected global economic recovery in 2010.

Review of 2008 Operations Operational Highlights



Having made progress through the operational integration process in 2007, BDO marshaled its resources towards completing this task in 2008. The goal was to present to the market the combined entity as one bank with a unified set of products. The path was long and difficult, and this was even made more complicated by the prevailing economic environment. However, the BDO organization proved itself prepared for the demands ahead.

As these reports from the different operating units indicate, the Bank attained more than harmonization in 2008; the benefits of the merger already became apparent in the 'top line' business development results. The remaining challenge is to translate these same benefits on the cost and efficiency side of the business.



IT CAN ONLY GET BETTER WITH MORE BRANCHES.

INTERMEDIATION ACTIVITIES

The Bank's lending and deposit-taking activities defied the gloomy scenarios as they registered industry leading growth numbers in resources, loans, deposits and assets under management while continuously improving loan delinquencies ratios. Given the expanded client base of the combined entity, the focus was primarily on preserving the Bank's long-term relationships and improving asset quality, ensuring that it is poised for action when the economic cycle turns.

BUSINESS LENDING

The Institutional Banking Group (IBG) delivered a strong 48% increase in its business loan portfolio driven by a 55% increase in the corporate banking market and a 36% expansion in middle market lending. The Group's focus has been on expanding business with existing relationships, drawing upon its competitive edge from the combined entity's post-merger capabilities. Given its new balance sheet strength, IBG also partnered with BDO Capital and Investment Corp. to take an active role in large project finance transactions requiring syndicated facilities. These lending activities were complemented by local and offshore third-party funding sources which further improved asset spreads and risk profile.

The increase in the portfolio was broad-based and evident in most industries. Exposure grew the most in the utilities, food and beverage, financial services and transport industries, where industry restructuring initiatives have been most active. Traditional working capital lending was also boosted by the substantial rise in commodity prices giving rise to increased trade financing requirements.

BDO Leasing and Finance, Inc., the Bank's listed subsidiary, complemented the business lending activity as it continues to dominate its leasing and finance market niche. Total assets grew by 10% with operating revenues expanding by 14% compared to 2007 on the back of strong provincial expansion and aggressive market coverage. With capitalization standing at P4.5 billion, it firmly holds its position as the leader in the industry.

BDO emerges as the only bank in the country to issue all four credit card brands, namely MasterCard, American Express, Visa, and JCB.



CONSUMER LENDING

The Consumer Lending loans portfolio expanded by 31% compared to the previous year on the back of strong growth from all its business lines. It now comprises 14% of the Bank's total loan portfolio.

Defying the global trend of weakened car sales, the Auto Loans business capitalized on the distribution capabilities of the Bank's extensive branch network to expand its business in key provincial areas. Complementing the branch activity were efforts to generate interest through alternative distribution channels such as the successful Deals On Wheels program. Overall, the auto loan business generated a 24% growth for the year.

The Home Loans business continues to be a major driver of consumer loan growth, registering a 48% annual growth for 2008. Fueling it were the group's strategic alliances with the major developers in the real estate industry. Coupled with a re-engineered origination and underwriting process, the Home Loans business is expected to be a major growth driver in the years to come.

On the unsecured side of the business, the portfolio of Personal Loans increased by 22%, aided by a focused marketing program applied in growing geographical provincial areas. The addition of the American Express Philippine card business expanded the BDO cardholder

base to over 800,000 cards. In terms of organic growth, the Bank's credit card issuing business also posted double-digit growth in portfolio size, now ranking 3rd in card receivable base and 2nd in card billings among the Philippine card issuers. The Bank's merchant acquiring business maintained its top position with the consolidation of the Equitable Card Network and American Express portfolios. The combined merchant base is the largest among credit card acquiring businesses, with BDO emerging as the only bank in the country to issue all four credit card brands, namely MasterCard, American Express, Visa, and JCB.

BRANCH BANKING

The size and reach of the Bank's extensive branch network now serves as an effective distribution network for its banking services. Anchored on accessibility and convenience, the benefits of scale and branding were now very much apparent from the growth in the network's origination and deposit-taking activities. Deposits grew by 43%, bringing the average deposit per branch to almost a billion pesos.

Programmed steps were taken to strategically improve the Bank's distribution balance throughout the country. The conversion of EPCIBank branches, which started in July 2007, continued during the first half of 2008. By year-end, 41 branches of Equitable Savings

Bank were likewise converted into BDO branches and re-deployed as appropriate. Additionally, 31 branches were opened in previously untapped areas, specifically in the provincial markets. The Bank's branch network stood at 665 by year-end 2008. Through a common legal entity, the Bank now has a uniform and consistent approach to the market nationwide, eschewing the traditional commercial bank/savings bank divide. Such a strategy simplifies client servicing, allows for a consistent set of services across all its distribution outlets and unifies branding and marketing efforts.

To maximize the Bank's service and presence, banking days and banking hours were extended. Where appropriate, branches are open during weekends, including Sundays. In addition, banking hours were likewise extended to as late as 7pm in mall branches. These innovations, along with a solid service culture in the branches, clearly demonstrate the BDO slogan, "We Find Ways."

TREASURY

Having braced itself for a volatile year, BDO has had to face the effects of the financial crisis head-on. From mark-to-market impact to credit concerns to capital planning, the Treasury group had to balance its strategy - from being defensive and conservative on one hand to being supportive of asset growth on the other. Throughout this process however, Treasury maintained the Bank's strong financial position and ended the year on strong footing to take advantage of the opportunities in 2009. It continued to be recognized as one of the Best Performing Government Securities Eligible Dealers both in the primary and secondary markets. On the foreign exchange side, BDO was among the top five most active market participants. And for the second straight year, Asiamoney Polls named Banco De Oro Unibank, Inc. as the Best Domestic Provider of FX Services.

In support of the Bank's goals for 2008, the Treasury Group continued to



provide clients with competitive foreign exchange rates and financial instruments that enhanced their investment yield as well as hedged their foreign exchange and interest rate risk exposures. The past year also called for a concerted effort to upgrade the treasury system and expand its transaction coverage as the Bank worked for the renewal of its derivatives license. It expects a successful migration to OPICS Plus in early 2009.

The Treasury Group remains committed to maintain its status as one of the top players in the foreign exchange and fixed income markets. It will also continue to be mindful of market conditions as it pursues profitable capital market opportunities.

SERVICE-BASED ACTIVITIES

Realizing that banking is now a multi-faceted business, BDO recognized early the importance of service businesses as an important contributor to fee income. Its emphasis on these businesses has been increased efficiency, product and service competitiveness, and market-responsiveness to change. Slow but steady, these service businesses generate substantial fee income to provide a cushion to the Bank's earnings throughout an economic cycle.

• TRUST AND INVESTMENTS

The Bank's Trust and Investments Group continues with its growth momentum, capping the year with P338.2 billion in assets under management. Despite the market volatility of the financial markets, the group managed a healthy growth rate of 23% from last year's level. As a result, it garnered a 25% share of the domestic trust business and led in the pooled funds category as its Unit Investment Trust Funds took a 31% market share.

Its success was made more meaningful as it was driven by a good mix of retail and institutional business as well as ready-made and customized portfolios.

The Group's performance was evident in its top ranking in the 95th Watson Wyatt Survey on Investment Performance of Retirement Funds in the Philippines under the All Trusteed Funds category for Investment Managers handling at least five funds. Furthermore, in an independent study, the BDO Peso Money Market Fund was awarded by MoneySense Magazine as "Best Value for Money" based on its 2008 performance.

The Bank is poised to preserve these gains by continuing to tailor its comprehensive array of trust and investment products and services to meet the diverse and evolving needs of its clients.

• PRIVATE BANKING

An extremely volatile and challenging global financial environment presented both a problem and an opportunity for the Bank's private banking business. BDO Private Bank saw net interest income remain flat at P444 million, as net interest margins narrowed during the year. Its reported net income dropped to P101.9 million for the year as it was affected by mark-to-market revaluations.

On the positive side, BDO Private Bank's value during difficult times became more apparent. Total assets grew by 49% year-on-year to P36.6 billion while total assets under management (AUM) jumped 36%. The Bank also expanded its distribution network and staff to service a growing client base with the opening of several client servicing offices nationwide. These successes have not been unnoticed by the investing community as BDO Private Bank was awarded Best Private Bank in the Philippines by FinanceAsia and Best Private Wealth Management House in the Philippines by Alpha Southeast Asia in 2008.



INSURANCE – BROKERAGE & BANCASSURANCE

BDO's foray into the insurance business is driven through its subsidiary, BDO Insurance Brokers, Inc. (BDOI) and its Bancassurance partnerships with Generali Pilipinas and Philam Equitable Life Assurance Corp. (PELAC).

2008 saw a significant leap in Bancassurance premiums through the brisk sales of Variable Life Products by PELAC and later in the year, of traditional products with Generali. The combined efforts of PELAC and Generali yielded a 19% growth in total premiums notwithstanding the integration efforts still in progress throughout most of the year.

Non-life business grew by 34% for the year, boosted mainly by increased business from middle market clients. Looking ahead, BDOI plans to redirect and strengthen its efforts in the non-life business by focusing on growing its middle market, employee benefits, and consumer segments.

• INVESTMENT BANKING

Even as the markets slowed due to unfavorable conditions, BDO's investment banking subsidiary, BDO Capital & Investment Corporation, remained an active player in the capital markets. It participated as joint issue manager and/or domestic lead underwriter in the year's two Global Initial Public Offerings (Pepsi Cola Products Phils., Inc. and San Miguel Brewery, Inc.) and two preferred shares issues (First Philippine Holdings Corp. and Ayala Corp.), totaling P21.8 billion (USD496 million).

BDO Capital also lead managed a total of P83.3 billion (USD1.8 billion) of notes, bonds, and loans for several corporate entities, including, among others, Fortune Tobacco Corp., Maynilad Water Services, Inc., Metro Pacific Investments Corp., Philippine Airlines, and



SN Aboitiz Power-Benguet, Inc. Moreover, it participated either as selling agent or underwriter in government and corporate fixed-income issuances totaling P88.5 billion (USD2.0 billion).

Its performance earned for BDO Capital the continued recognition of international publications, including the following: Best Investment Bank and Best Bond House in the Philippines by Finance Asia; Best Equity House and Best Debt House in the Philippines by Asiamoney; Best Domestic Investment Bank and Best Equity House in the Philippines by The Asset Magazine; and Best Investment Bank, Best Bond House and Best Equity House in the Philippines by Alpha Southeast Asia.

CASH MANAGEMENT & ELECTRONIC BANKING

Running a business around payments and information processing, the Transaction Banking Group (TBG) services both the retail (electronic banking) and corporate (cash management) segments.

The electronic banking business registered a 31% growth in revenues driven by the expanded client base and branch network of the Bank. On the other hand, the cash management business reported a hefty 245% increase in mandates. The highlight for the year was the activation of the Bills Payment facility for US Non-Immigrant Visa fees, which gives US visa applicants the convenience of BDO's nationwide payment acceptance as well as the longest banking hours in the industry.

Heralding TBG's banner year were awards from prestigious international publications Asiamoney and Alpha Southeast Asia, which named BDO as the Best Local Currency Cash Management Bank and Best Cash Management Bank in the country, respectively. Mastercard Worldwide also cited TBG's Cash Card as the Best Prepaid Program for their Smart Money Co-Branded Card product and on the local front, the Social Security System recognized BDO as Best Collecting Commercial Bank for the second consecutive year.

REMITTANCE

Notwithstanding worries over a decline in OFW remittances as an effect of the global crisis, the Remittance unit continued to focus its efforts on expanding its network of domestic and international partners. These yielded a 23% growth in OFW revenue as well an 8% increase in US dollar volume in 2008, while transactions from the Bank's remittance business improved by 9%.

The unit's international remittance network now comprises thousands of combined BDO remittance offices, remittance partners, and agent locations in Asia, the Middle East, North America, and Europe. Cash pick-up locations in the Philippines also increased to over 3,000. Aside from BDO branches, remittance pick-up transactions are served at SM retail outlets and major financial service providers such as pawnshops and rural

banks. Partnerships with these financial providers now include Cebuana Lhuillier, M. Lhuillier, Enterprise Bank and Peninsula Rural Bank. These origination and distribution networks were complemented by major marketing events both locally and overseas.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The year 2008 brought to the fore the imperative for prudent risk management, especially in light of increasing concerns over the slowdown in the world economy. The Bank's Credit and Risk Management Group (CRMG) took on the responsibility of adopting the Bank's risk management system and processes to meet the demands of the times for the short term and the sustainability of business for the long term.

CREDIT AND REMEDIAL MANAGEMENT

CRMG's credit task for 2008 was a delicate balance between harmonizing the merged Bank's credit policies, procedures and guidelines while simultaneously being responsive to the global economic uncertainties. Realizing that the business of banking is about taking calculated risks and not avoiding it, the group provides a healthy second opinion on credit exposures put forward by lending units. Through rapid portfolio reviews, financial due diligence and scenario analyses, the group is able to assist the lending units by highlighting vulnerabilities and strengths of industries as well as the potential winners and losers within those industries.

On a policy level, the group constantly updates the Bank's credit policies to cope with changes in economic conditions and tools of the trade.

CRMG's remedial management function was also able to reduce Non-Performing Loans by close to P3.0 billion through collections, restructuring and settlements through dacion or foreclosures. Frequent progress review of problem accounts and time-bound work-out plans contribute to quicker turnaround and resolution.



MARKET AND LIQUIDITY RISK MANAGEMENT

CRMG's market and liquidity risk management function completed integration of the BDO Group subsidiaries into an integrated risk management infrastructure. Methodologies to capture and analyze all material sources of market and liquidity risks were implemented across all financial portfolios.

The major principles behind the Bank's liquidity management include the regular measurement of the Bank's liquidity risk under both Business-As-Usual (BAU) and stress conditions; the significant role of the Asset Liability Management Committee (ALCO) in enforcing the Bank's liquidity management policy; and the establishment of a contingency plan for liquidity pressures that may arise from unexpected internal or financial market developments.

For market risk management, the key measures used by the Bank are the Value-at-Risk (VaR) for the trading book and Earnings-at-Risk (EaR) for the accrual book. VaR is a statistical estimate of the maximum possible loss on a given trading position within a given time while EaR is a measure of likely earnings volatility for accrual portfolios calculated as the change in income over the next 12 months. Stress testing – an essential part of the measurement procedure not only for liquidity risk management but also for market risk management – played a critical part in the market and liquidity risk calculations during the volatile year.

OPERATING RISK MANAGEMENT

Following a roll-out of the BDO Operational Risk Management Framework, workshops continued with management and their operational risk coordinators to promote risk consciousness and instill the discipline of risk identification, assessment and mitigation, especially in the areas of business continuity, information security, legal and regulatory compliance, outsourcing and complaints/feedback management. Operational risk compliance is a dynamic process that continues to be driven at the business line level under strict guidelines and reporting mechanisms handled by CRMG.

In 2008, the Bank approved its Health, Social and Environment (HSE) Policy for implementation, underscoring the Bank's corporate responsibility to its customers, employees, and the community. Going into 2009, the Bank will focus on risk management tools starting with the set- up of a loss database consistent with Basel II definitions, and the launch of the assessment process using Key Risk Indicators (KRI) and Key Controls Self-Assessment (KCSA) as alerts for operational risk vulnerabilities.

ASSET MANAGEMENT

The Bank's Asset Management Group is responsible for maintaining and disposing of the Bank's acquired assets. Total disposals for 2008 totaled P4 billion with a good mix of commercial properties, residential properties and chattels.

The group retooled its marketing and sales organization, ventured into costeffective marketing campaigns, and launched a publication, Asset Magazine, to boost awareness of the Bank's saleable properties. Sales network was also expanded, focusing on big-ticket items and subdivision properties. Where sale is not an immediate option, lease strategies are being put in place to defray maintenance expenses and contribute additional income to the Bank.

SERVICE AND SUPPORT INITIATIVES

Undoubtedly critical to the success of the Bank in general and of the integration process in particular was the support of the Bank's service and support units. These include the human resources (HR), information technology (IT), central operations (COG), compliance and corporate marketing functions.

HUMAN RESOURCE

Following through on the post-merger thrust to shape and solidify a 'One BDO' culture, the HR function focused on harmonizing HR processes and systems, reengineered the employee acquisition process and launched a broad orientation program anchored on the principles of 'We Find Ways' – a formidable challenge in an 18,000-strong organization.

HR's key priorities in 2008 were the implementation of a robust employee acquisition program to support business plans as well as enhanced technical training programs to align and upgrade employee skills with business requirements. The group also directed the seamless migration of subsidiaries' HR processes towards a centralized HR service delivery system, specifically in recruitment, benefits management, and payroll services. Behind the scenes, systems enhancement was undertaken as well to support employee database management for manpower planning, performance management, and employee payroll.

• INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Most evident in the Bank's efforts to build a system primed for the challenges ahead was information technology. IT's mandate for 2008 were anchored on seamless integration, capacity planning, security enhancements and organizational development.

Integration and capacity planning were completed without much of the issues confronting big conversions. IT completed the migration of EPCIB, ESB and AMEX branches to BDO systems. Branch and offsite ATMs were converted as well as all electronic channels such as internet, corporate, and telephone banking services. ECN's JCB and Mastercard card bases were converted to the

BDO system. Moreover, applications were consolidated and hardware and software upgrades were implemented to ensure the stability of BDO systems in spite of increased transaction volumes.

The conversion of system users to the BDO infrastructure translated into significant savings on previously outsourced IT services. IT will continue to support the process improvement and cost efficiency projects under integration, bearing in mind that technology remains a powerful tool in BDO's sustained expansion.

CORPORATE MARKETING

The corporate marketing function handles the institutional marketing for the BDO Group, ensuring consistency in branding approach and budget allocation. The corporate marketing group also handles the BDO Rewards program.

2008 saw the extension of BDO's branding campaign, showing more consistency, order and focus in the Bank's marketing thrust. One Bank, one face, one service is the battle cry for the integration. All of these would not have been appreciated without a coherent marketing campaign orchestrated by the group.

BDO Rewards, the Bank's loyalty program that was introduced to clients in 2005, underwent significant enhancements in 2008. Already a far-reaching service in that it comprises most of the banking transactions in BDO and all purchases from SM Group, BDO Rewards showed once again how the Bank thinks ahead to benefit its loyal clients.

Among the enhancements is a four-tiered scheme that effectively rewards members as it takes into account the total value of their business with BDO. These four tiers are Emerald, Ruby, Sapphire, and ultimately Diamond – the higher the tier, the more benefits enjoyed by the client from the Bank as well as from SM and its affiliates.

CENTRAL OPERATIONS AND COMPLIANCE

The heart of all the integration and operation of the Bank are the operating and control functions. While largely unseen, they play a major role in the integration process and the efficiency of the Bank. In 2008, the objective was harmonization and indeed, these functions carried the day as integration went smoothly and in no time, the residual problems – floats, customer service issues and service consistency – were all under control. 2009 will become an important year for these functions as the Bank starts to reengineer all of these to reflect the size, requirements and growth potential of the combined entity.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

The Bank established the BDO Foundation Inc. as its corporate social responsibility (CSR) arm and channel for its internal and external outreach program. It aims to respond to the needs of the marginalized sector of society

for decent shelter, sustainable livelihood and practical education.

As one of the highlights for the year, it donated land to the City of Taguig valued at P17 million for site development. Partnering with Gawad Kalinga Foundation Inc., it aims to build the social infrastructure and community for the informal settlers in the area.

BDO Foundation also donated P12 million for the construction of a micro-finance center in Laguna for the CARD MRI (Center for Agriculture and Rural Development-Mutually Reinforcing Institutions) Development Institute. The partnership with CARD-MRI aims to train people on using micro-finance and livelihood skills to help them alleviate poverty and develop the economic potentials of the countryside.

On a smaller scale, it also donated P1.5 million to a school in Cebu for building an audio-visual room.

In a move to integrate its CSR programs in the Bank's business, it launched the BDO Volunteer Program, generating over six hundred employee sign-ups in its maiden year. The program, which is aligned to BDO's mission and core values, aims to develop volunteerism as a BDO lifestyle.

The BDO Volunteer Program is divided into four basic activities: BDO Speakers Bureau, for conducting lecture series; BDO Skills Trainers, for facilitating arts and crafts training sessions; BDO Community Builders, for assistance in developing communities, and; BDO Fund Raisers for assistance in fund-raising to support the Foundation's initiatives

Ultimately, the Bank through BDO Foundation Inc. aims to be a major catalyst in the creation of opportunities for the under-privileged and in the country's socio-economic development.

SUMMARY

The year 2008 was a busy year and a year marked with mixed results. The financial crisis took its toll on the Bank's performance as mark-to-market losses and credit provisioning impacted negatively its net income. Despite these setbacks however, the organization continued to respond with zeal, creativity and determination. Beyond the headline numbers is an organization taking major strides in its ambition to be considered the best bank in the industry. Integration was completed in record time. Business development results continue to impress despite the integration process, a testament to the soundness of the business case behind the merger. Major investments in facilities, branches, technology and organization have already been put in place.

The accomplishments of the past year give the Bank the confidence in knowing that it is now more prepared to open bright new paths in 2009. It did what it had to do in 2008. The Bank now moves forward to 2009 with optimism and coming from a position of strength.

The Executive Committee is authorized to act on behalf of the Board on matters affecting the operations of the Bank, subject to legal limits and By-Laws of the Bank, and such ceilings that may be imposed by the Board. It has the authority to approve within the set limits, technology-related projects or such other initiatives for enhancing the Bank's operating and service delivery capabilities; operating policies and/or manuals; and endorse for approval of the Board the establishment of branches and/or extension offices as well as domestic or foreign subsidiaries.

The Committee also assumed the functions of the Board Credit Committee and is responsible for the review and approval of the Bank's loans and investments as well as other credit-related issues. It assesses the viability of credit and investment proposals (except those involving DOSRI or related party accounts), with specific attention to the appropriateness of the credit extension and risks involved. Proposals beyond its approving authority are endorsed to the Board. It also sees to regular credit reviews on per account and per portfolio bases, as well as assessments of credit policies and procedures, risk standards, and, where required, dissemination of credit manuals. The Committee meets at least once a week or as often as may be necessary to resolve all matters referred to it. It is composed of at least three (3) members of the Board including the President, and such members of senior management appointed/designated by the Board.

Board Audit Committee

The Board Audit Committee acts on behalf of the Board and provides oversight of the Bank's financial reporting and control as well as its internal and external audit functions. It reviews and assesses the Bank's annual audit plan, its system of internal controls, and regular financial and audit reports. It also reviews strategic issues relating to plans and policies, financial and system controls, and methods of operation, seeing to their adequacy and pinpointing possible improvements. The internal auditor and the independent external auditor of the Bank report to the Committee. It also exercises oversight over the Bank's compliance function. The Board Audit Committee meets at least once a month, and is composed of members of the Board, at least two of whom are independent directors, including the Chairman, with accounting, auditing or related financial management expertise or experience.

Compensation Committee

The Compensation Committee provides oversight on directors' compensation and remuneration of senior management and other key personnel. It ensures consistency of the compensation policies and practices with the corporate culture, strategy, and control environment of the Bank as well as with peer institutions, and designed to attract and retain qualified and competent individuals. It evaluates and recommends to the Board incentives and other equity-based plans for directors and senior management. The Compensation Committee meets at least once annually, and is composed of at least three members of the Board, one of whom is an independent director.

Corporate Governance Committee

The Corporate Governance Committee assists the Board in shaping the Bank's corporate governance policies and practices. Besides reviewing and assessing these policies and practices, it recommends applicable guidelines, monitors compliance, and recommends needed adjustments to ensure effectiveness. It also oversees the annual performance self-evaluation of the Board, its committees, and executive management, as well as conducts an annual self-evaluation of its performance. Where needed, it recommends measures for the directors' continuing education and succession plan. Moreover, the Committee Chair serves as a resource person in qualifying nominees to the Board, assignment to committees, succession plans for Board members and senior officers, and their remuneration commensurate with corporate and individual performance. The Corporate Governance Committee meets at least once every quarter, and is composed of at least three members of the Board, two of whom are independent directors.

The Nominations Committee provides oversight on the qualifications of all nominees to the Board of Directors as well as appointments to other Bank positions requiring Board approval. It recommends to the Board the slate of nominees for election to the Board of Directors of the Bank during the annual stockholders' meeting. In case of vacancy/ies in the Board of Directors, the Committee seeks qualified nominees and recommends them to the Board for appointment. The Nomination Committee meets at least once a year, and is composed of at least three members, one of whom is an independent director.

Risk Management Committee

The Risk Management Committee is responsible for policy development and oversight of the Bank's credit, market and operating risk exposures. It oversees the system of limits of discretionary authority delegated by the Board to management, ensuring that the limits are observed and breaches, if any, are immediately corrected. The Committee also establishes the framework for reporting risk to the Board including the assessment of the probability and potential impact of each identified risk exposure to the Bank. These reports include information on portfolio concentrations, value at risk measurements, and breaches on limits. Considering the importance of credit risk, the Executive Committee approves counter-party credit risk under the guidance of established policies, procedures, and guidelines set by the Risk Management Committee. The Committee meets at least once a month, and is composed of three members of the Board with risk expertise and adequate knowledge of the Bank's operational risk exposures.

Trust Committee

The Trust Committee, acting within the limits set by the Board of Directors, is authorized to review and approve transactions between trust and/or fiduciary accounts, to accept and close trust and other fiduciary accounts, and to approve the investment, reinvestment, and disposition of funds or property. It evaluates trust and other fiduciary accounts at least once a year to determine compliance with the instrument creating the trust or other fiduciary relationship, as well as the advisability of retaining or disposing the trust or fiduciary assets. The Trust Committee meets at least once a month, and is composed of five members. Of the five members, three are members of the Board who are not operating officers of the Bank or members of the Audit Committee, the President, and the Trust Officer.

Statement of Management's Responsibility for Financial Statements

The management of Banco De Oro Unibank, Inc. and Subsidiaries is responsible for all information and representations contained in the financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2008 and 2007. The financial statements have been prepared in conformity with financial reporting standards in the Philippines for banks and reflect amounts that are based on the best estimates and informed judgment of management with an appropriate consideration to materiality.

In this regard, management maintains a system of accounting and reporting which provides for the necessary internal controls to ensure that transactions are properly authorized and recorded, assets are safeguarded against unauthorized use or disposition and liabilities are recognized. The management likewise discloses to the Bank's audit committee and to its external auditor: (i) all significant deficiencies in the design or operation of internal controls that could adversely affect its ability to record, process, and report financial data; (ii) material weaknesses in the internal controls; and (iii) any fraud that involves management or other employees who exercise significant roles in internal controls.

The Board of Directors reviews the financial statements before such statements are approved and submitted to the stockholders of the Bank.

Punongbayan & Araullo, the independent auditors appointed by the stockholders, has examined the financial statements of the Bank in accordance with Philippine Standards on Auditing and has expressed its opinion on the fairness of presentation upon completion of such examination, in its report to the Board of Directors and stockholders.

Report of Independent Auditors
