PART I--FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Item 1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements of BDO Leasing & Finance, Inc. and Subsidiary are prepared and presented in accordance with Philippine Financial Reporting Framework.

The accounting policies and methods of computation used in the audited financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2018 were consistently applied in the interim financial reports.

Adoption of New Interpretations, Revisions and Amendments to PFRS

There are new PFRS, revisions, amendments, annual improvements and interpretations to existing standards that became effective in 2019. These include:

PFRS 16, Leases (effective from January 1, 2019). The new standard will eventually replace PAS 17, Leases.

For lessees, it requires to account for leases "on-balance sheet" by recognizing a "right of use" asset and a lease liability. The lease liability is initially measured as the present value of future lease payments. For this purpose, lease payments include fixed, non-cancellable payments for lease elements, amounts due under residual value guarantees, certain types of contingent payments and amounts due during optional periods to the extent that extension is reasonably certain. In subsequent periods, the "right-of-use" asset is accounted for similar to a purchased asset subject to depreciation or amortization. The lease liability is accounted for similar to a financial liability which is amortized using the effective interest method. However, the new standard provides important reliefs or exemptions for short-term leases and leases of low value assets. If these exemptions are used, the accounting is similar to operating lease accounting under PAS 17 where lease payments are recognized as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term or another systematic basis (if more representative of the pattern of the lessee's benefit).

For lessors, lease accounting is similar to PAS 17's. In particular, the distinction between finance and operating leases is retained. The definitions of each type of lease, and the supporting indicators of a finance lease, are substantially the same as PAS 17's. The basic accounting mechanics are also similar, but with some different or more explicit guidance in few areas. These include variable payments, subleases, lease modifications, the treatment of initial direct costs and lessor disclosures.

PAS 19 (Amendments), Employee Benefits – Plan Amendment, Curtailment or Settlement - (effective January 1, 2019). The amendments require the use of updated actuarial assumptions to determine current service cost and net interest for the remainder of the annual reporting period after the plan amendment, curtailment or settlement when the entity remeasures its net defined benefit liability (asset).

PAS 28 (Amendments), Investment in Associates – Long-term Interest in Associates and Joint Venture (effective from January 1, 2019). The amendments clarify that the scope exclusion in PFRS 9 applies only to ownership interests accounted for using the equity method. Thus, the amendments further clarify that long-term interests in an associate or joint venture – to which the equity method is not applied – must be accounted for under PFRS 9, which shall also include long-term interests that, in substance, form part of the entity's net investment in an associate or joint venture.

PFRS 9 (Amendments), Financial Instruments – Prepayment Features with Negative Compensation (effective from January 1, 2019). The amendments clarify that prepayment features with negative compensation attached to financial instruments may still qualify under the "solely payments of principal and interests" (SPPI) test. As such, the financial assets containing prepayment features with negative compensation may still be classified at amortized cost or at FVOCI.

PFRS 10 (Amendments), Consolidated Financial Statements, and PAS 28 (Amendments), Investments in Associates and Joint Ventures — Sale or Contribution of Assets between an Investor and its Associates or Joint Venture (effective date deferred indefinitely). The amendments to PFRS 10 require full recognition in the investor's financial statements of gains or losses arising on the sale or contribution of assets that constitute a business as defined in PFRS 3, Business Combinations, between an investor and its associate or joint venture. Accordingly, the partial recognition of gains or losses (i.e., to the extent of the unrelated investor's interests in an associate or joint venture) only applies to those sale or contribution of assets that do not constitute a business. Corresponding amendments have been made to PAS 28 to reflect these changes. In addition, PAS 28 has been amended to clarify that when determining whether assets that are sold or contributed constitute a business, an entity shall consider whether the sale or contribution of those assets is part of multiple arrangements that should be accounted for as a single transaction.

IFRIC 23, Uncertainty over Income Tax Treatments (effective from January 1, 2019). The interpretation provides clarification on the determination of taxable profit, tax bases, unused tax losses, unused tax credits, and tax rates when there is uncertainty over income tax treatments. The core principle of the interpretation requires the Company to consider the probability of the tax treatment being accepted by the taxation authority. When it is probable that the tax treatment will be accepted, the determination of the taxable profit, tax bases, unused tax losses, unused tax credits, and tax rates shall be on the basis of the accepted tax treatment. Otherwise, the Company has to use the most likely amount or the expected value, depending on the surrounding circumstances, in determining the tax accounts identified immediately above.

Annual Improvements to PFRS 2015-2017 Cycle. Among the improvements, the following amendments are relevant to the Company but had no material impact on the Company's financial statements as these amendments merely clarify existing requirements:

- •PAS 12 (Amendments), Income Taxes Tax Consequences of Dividends. The amendments clarify that all income tax consequence of dividend payments should be recognized in profit or loss.
- •PAS 23 (Amendments), Borrowing Costs Eligibility for Capitalization. The amendments clarify that any specific borrowing which remains outstanding after the related qualifying asset is ready for its intended purpose, such borrowing will then form part of the entity's general borrowings when calculating the capitalization rate for capitalization purposes.
- •PFRS 3 (Amendments), Business Combinations, and PFRS 11 (Amendments),
 Joint Arrangements Remeasurement of Previously Held Interests in a Joint Operation. The
 amendments clarify that previously held interest in a joint operation shall be remeasured when the
 Group obtains control of the business. On the other hand, previously held interests in a joint operation
 shall not be remeasured when the Group obtains joint control of the business.

Item 2. MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF FINANCIAL CONDITION AND RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

March 2019 Compared to March 2018

Gross revenues amounted to P795.0 million, an increase of 2% from P782.8 million last year. This was due to the higher interest rates on loans and receivables finance.

Interest and financing charges rose 75% to P436.9 million due primarily to higher funding costs under the current interest rate environment.

There were no provisions for impairment losses booked in 2019, as determined under the latest risk evaluation model following PFRS 9 standards and requirements.

Occupancy and equipment related expenses increased 12% to P13.1 million. Depreciation Expense-Operating Lease went down 7% to P198.4 million due to the maturity of various Operating Leases.

Litigation/assets acquired expenses decreased 57% to P2.0 million.

The company registered P24.1 million net loss for the quarter ending March 2019 due to margin compression as the company's liabilities, which are short-term in nature, adjusted immediately to the current higher interest rates as compared to its lease receivables, which typically carry fixed interest rates for 3-5 years. This situation is seen as temporary, as new loan bookings carry higher yields and loan repricings are eventually expected to adjust to current interest rates, resulting in the normalization of interest margins.

Total assets declined 10% year-on-year to P38.1 billion, mainly due to investment maturities and sale of part of the company's lower yielding portfolio. This was meant to mitigate the impact of the margin compression as explained in the previous paragraph. As a result, the company's Loans and Other Receivables decreased 10%. In March 2019, Property, Plant and Equipment-net also decreased 3% or P63.9 million.

Cash & cash equivalents went down by 12% or P34 million as the Company's free funds were used to pay maturing obligations. Financial Asset at Fair Value through Other Comprehensive Income went down 19% to P3.7 billion due to maturity of investment in stocks.

Net investment properties went up to P361 million from P347 million. Other Assets decreased year-on-year to P693 million from P844 million.

Bills Payable decreased to P26.1 billion consistent with decline in volumes in Loans & Other Receivables.

Accounts Payable, accrued expenses and other liabilities decreased to P608.9 million year-onyear mainly due to decreased in outstanding check payments to supplier/dealers.

Lease deposits went down from P6.2 billion in March 2018 to P5.9 billion, consistent with decline in volumes.

Stockholders' equity stood at P5.4 billion.

- (a) The Group maintains savings and demand deposit accounts with BDO Unibank. As of 31 March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March, 2018, savings and demand deposit accounts maintained with BDO Unibank are included under Cash and Cash Equivalents account in the statements of financial position. Interest income earned on these deposits in March 31, 2019 and March 31, 2018 is included as part of Interest and Discounts under the Revenues account in the statements of income.
- (b) The Group obtains short-term bills payable from BDO Unibank. The amount outstanding from borrowings as of March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018 is presented under Bills Payable account in the statements of financial position. Interest expense incurred on these bills payable in March 31, 2019 and March 31, 2018 is included as part of Interest and Financing Charges under Operating Costs and Expenses account in the statements of income.

- (c) The Parent Company leases its head office premises and certain branch offices from BDO Unibank for terms ranging from three to five years, renewable for such period and under such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon with the Parent Company and BDO Unibank. Related rent expense incurred in March 31, 2019 and March 31, 2018 is presented as part of Occupancy and equipment-related expenses under Operating Costs and Expenses account in the statements of income. On the other hand, the Parent Company charges BDO Rental for the spaces that the latter occupies in the head office premises. Rent charged to BDO Rental in March 31, 2019 and March 31, 2018 is presented as part of Other Income in the statements of income. There is no outstanding receivable and payable on these transactions as of the end of March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018.
- (d) In 2013, the Parent Company entered into a service level agreement with BDO Unibank wherein BDO Unibank will charge the Parent Company for certain management services that the former provides to the latter. Management fees paid by the Parent Company to BDO Unibank is shown as part of Other Operating Costs and Expenses in the statements of income. Also, the Parent Company charges BDO Rental for the management services it renders to BDO Rental. This is presented as part of Other Income in the Parent Company's statements of income. - (e) The Parent Company sold its portion of its receivable to BDO Unibank. The Parent Company charged BDO for service charges and fees which are presented as part of Service Fees and other Income in the statements of income. There are no outstanding payable related on this transaction as of the end of March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018.
- (f) In 2018, the Parent Company entered into an agreement with BDO Unibank on stock transfer where BDO Unibank will charge the Parent Company for stock transfer services. Service fees paid by the Parent Company to BDO Unibank are shown as part of Other Expenses account under Operating Costs and Expenses in the statements of income. There are no outstanding payable related on this transaction as of the end of March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018.
- (g) The Parent Company engaged the services of BDO Capital and Investment Corporation (BDO Capital), a wholly owned subsidiary of BDO Unibank for underwriting services related to the Parent Company's issuance of short term commercial papers. Service and charges fees paid by the Parent Company to BDO Capital both for March 31, 2019 and March 31, 2018 is included as part of Other Operating Costs and Expenses in the statements of income. There are no outstanding payable related on this transaction as of the end of March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018.
- (h) Compensation of key management personnel (covering officer positions starting from Assistant Vice President and up) is included as part of Employee Benefits under Operating Costs and Expenses in the statements of comprehensive income of the Group and Parent Company. Short-term employee benefits include salaries, paid annual leave and paid sick leave, profit sharing and bonuses, and non-monetary benefits. The Group also granted loans to officers which are secured by mortgage on the property, bear interest with a range of 7.0% to 9.0% per annum and have terms ranging from 3 to 4 years. Outstanding loans to officers are presented as part of Finance Lease Receivable under Loans and Other Receivables account. The Group assessed that these loans are not impaired as of March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018.

- (i) The retirement fund holds, as an investment, 519,915 shares of stock of the Parent Company in 2019 and 2018, respectively, which has a market value of P2.28 and P3.10 per share as of March 31, 2019 and 2018, respectively. The retirement fund does not hold any shares of stock of BDO Unibank.
- (j) In 2018, BDO Rental declared Cash Dividends which is presented as part of other income in the Parent company's statement of income in March 31, 2018. This resulted for outstanding receivable of the Parent Company from BDO Rental in 2018 which is recorded as part of Dividends receivable under Loans and Other Receivables account in the statements of financial position in March 31, 2018.
- (k) The Parent Company earned from BDO Insurance Brokers, Inc. (BDO Insurance) service charges and fees for accounts referred and are included as part of Service Fees and other Income. This resulted for outstanding receivable of the Parent Company from BDO Insurance in March 31, 2019, December 31, 2018 and March 31, 2018 which is recorded as part of Accounts receivables under Loans and Other Receivables account in the statements of financial position. The Parent assessed that such receivable is not impaired.
- (I) In 2017, the Parent Company obtains short-term bills payable from BDO Strategic Holdings Inc. and SM Prime Holdings, Inc. The amount outstanding from borrowings from borrowings is presented under Bills Payable account in the statement of financial position. Interest expense incurred on these bills payable is included as part of Interest and Financing Charges account under Operating Costs and Expenses in the March 31, 2019 and March 31, 2018.
- (m) The Parent Company paid BDO Life Assurance Company, Inc for Group Life Insurance of the Parent Company's employees. Insurance paid by Parent Company is presented as part of Occupancy and Equipment Related Expense under Operating Costs and Expenses in March 31, 2019 statement of income.
- (n) In 2017, BDO Rental, entered into Operating Lease Agreement with BDO Nomura Securities, Inc. (BDO Nomura) which commenced in 2018. Prepaid rental made by BDO Nomura is included as part of Other Liabilities under Accounts Payable and Other Liabilities account in March 31, 2018 statement of financial position. BDO Rental entered into Operating Lease Agreement with SM Prime Holdings, Inc. and Alfamart Trading Philippines, Inc. Operating lease income earned from these transactions is presented as part of Rent account in the Group's statement of income. No outstanding receivable on this transaction as of the end of March 31, 2019 and December 31, 2018.
